
Project elements

- Installation of a concrete bulb and ADA accessible curb ramps at the intersection of S Washington St and 14th Ave S
- Better identification of the Bailey Gatzert Elementary school zone with a new school sign
- Installation of a speed limit beacon along 12th Ave S between Boren Ave and Yesler Way

Project benefits

- Improved pedestrian safety and ADA accessibility
- Increased pedestrian and bicyclist visibility
- Shortened crossing distances at intersections
- Improved awareness of school and school zone speeds


